We expect to post, on the INT web page, scanned transparencies of all talks presented during the Charge-Symmetry Breaking in Few-Nucleon System mini-workshop (see http://int.phys.washington.edu/talk list.html).

If you will be speaking during this workshop, please remember to submit your talk either in hardcopy or electronic format.

Hardcopy talk submission

- 1. **As soon as possible** after you have given your talk, hand in your transparencies to Lesley Reece in the INT main office.
- 2. They will be scanned in by the INT staff and posted on our web site.
- 3. **Please note:** It generally takes one to two days to have the talks scanned. If you need it back immediately, please inform the Lesley Reece.

Electronic talk submission

If you have a PDF, Postscript file, or PowerPoint file of your talk, you may submit it electronically.

- 1. **Please submit** your talk as soon as possible after you have presented it.
- 2. **Please name your file** with your last name, then "CSBmw." For example: Kaplan.CSBmw.pdf
- 3. **Please don't forget** to include your last name in the file name. If you name your file "INT Talk" or "Seattle," we might get it mixed up with someone else's talk.
- 4. **We currently accept** Postscript, PDF, and TIFF/pnm files (no LaTex or PowerPoint, please). NOTE: If you have multiple files, please tar and gzip them together.
- 5. **For PowerPoint talks**, please convert the file to PDF before sending. If you need help with the process, please ask the INT staff.
- 6. Attach the talk to an email. Use the subject line < lastname > CSBmw
